Question: Would you say your on schedule, behind schedule or ahead schedule?

Matt Flood responded: On iPad deployment, we are way ahead of schedule. It did take a little more work because the schedule might have changed, but we are getting them in the kids hand a lot faster than what we have done in the past.

Question: Are we still one on one with iPad to student across the whole district?

Matt Flood responded: We are, but the only place we held back at is Pre-K. They do things a little different, something to do with our new Pre-K program. (Left brain, Right brain)

Question: Did the high schools get new ones this year or they end of life this year?

Matt Flood responded: So, the high schools did not get new ones this year. They are reaching and are three years old now. We are looking for opportunities to replace those in the future. I actually did apply for a grant (a couple of weeks ago) to help fund some of that for our free mortgage students. I am hoping to receive some additional federal funding to help replace at the high school level. I will not know for a couple of months if we got approved for that funding.

Question: Did we fund those in the bond for the high school replacement or not?

Matt Flood responded: I don't think we did. We requested but it was pulled from the original bond.

Question: Can you take a wild guess as to what the cost will be for the high schools?

Matt Flood responded: I know, I applied for 1.8 million but that's only for 70%. So, it going to be over 2 to 2.5 million, without me putting a calculator to it. We have about 65 hundred kids times 400 dollars a piece, roughly that is what the number would be.

Question: Can you give us an idea of what the temporary furniture is or looks like for E.F Green students and faculty? **Brenda Garcia responded:** It is actually very limited. We were short on 2 to 3 student desk per classroom, so we pulled some from the warehouse. Right now they have a mix, but the majority have the correct furniture. The teachers have their correct desk

and all the office furniture is correct on that campus. We were just missing some student desks and computer desks that Matt had alluded about the computer labs, but we are currently not using the computer labs just yet. At Stuart we had some longer delays, I think because they had furniture available in their west wing for that campus. For example the office furniture had not arrived yet, so the office personnel has been using their existing furniture. We do have again a mixture of some new desk for students and old ones for additional furniture. (only used furniture wherever needed)

Question: Was the furniture impact more at E.F. Green and less at Stuart?

Brenda Garcia responded: It is actually less at E.F. Green.

Question: With San Jacinto and Pumphrey are they on schedule?

Brenda Garcia responded: Yes.

Question: Are we expecting any delays?

Brenda Garcia responded: No sir, these are both on schedule.

Dr. O'Brien commented: We benefited by having two different contractors on the same prototype because they were competing against one another. The word on that was they were going to finish by Thanksgiving but now they are going to finish on time. **Question:** What is the opening looking like for students?

Dr. O'Brien responded: San Jacinto is a complete move. Every teacher on campus will be moving into a new building and vacating the old building. Pumphrey is a rezoning process. The likelihood would be that the students and teachers will move in January to San Jacinto more so than Pumphrey. As for Pumphrey we have begun the teacher hiring process. It will not be because of construction, but because of a teacher shortage that we will delay the opening possibly in January. There has been talks about a spring break opening, but the question is what would be the benefit for a spring break opening. Pumphrey has not been decided, so this is still on the table. We are certain that San Jacinto will be an easy transition; everyone goes home for Christmas and when they come back everyone is located in a new building. This is the current status but subject to change based upon many factors; including the construction schedule and employment opportunities. Just so everyone will know we don't have to employ a brand new faculty which is 60 employees for an elementary some of those will transfer as we rezone. The issue is sometimes the rezoning can take up to 90 days, so do we start now or start in January these are the factors we are taking into consideration.

Construction Schedule

- Close out on Stuart Construction Lab and E.F. Green Junior School #6 in Phase 4.
- 26 months into the bond we are 2/3rds of the way complete with construction.
- · Both San Jacinto and Pumphrey schedules are tight, but working with our contractor to have those completed.
- We have a little bit of float in the schedule for the Field House along with Ed. Service Center Phase 2, looking to start this in the next couple of weeks in September as well as for Sterling Fine Arts Renovation.

Question/Answers

Question: Will those projects finish on time with the delay? (Field house, Ed .Service Center & Sterling Fine Arts Renovation) **Clem Medina responded:** We have plenty of float, the master schedule shows us all the way out until 2023. I don't know that it will take that duration giving the size of these facilities. We have plenty of float with these projects to work with.

Question: Is the Junior School Running Track Baytown Junior?

Clem Medina responded: That is all Junior Schools.

Question: Did we get delayed do to weather?

Clem Medina responded: We did push this out about a month due to the rain. We are winding down Highlands Junior and are now focused on Baytown as well as Cedar Bayou. With these two facilities, this is where a lot of our man power is.

Dr O'brien commented: From my understand there was manpower issues, so they have been prioritizing to try and finish. **Clem Medina commented:** One thing that hurt us was the weather, but when those crews are not working they look for other work. When we dried up those crews were intended to come back were not there. It did take a little longer to get all that manpower on site but we are ramping up again.

Question: Do you think we will be done by October?

Clem Medina responded: We are shooting for the end of September.

Brenda Garcia commented: Another item about Baytown Junior is that they had an existing field, so they have shifted some of that work over to Horace Mann.

Question: Are the tracks finished on all schools?

Clem Medina responded: No, Gentry and Horace Mann are complete. Highlands is about 75 to 80% complete. Baytown

Junior, we still have quite a bit of work to do probably another month and then for Cedar Bayou another 3 weeks.

Question: So we are showing \$638,000.00 over budget already on the tracks, is that going to increase?

Clem Medina responded: No increasing cost there, it was just delayed due to weather. We already had this endorsement for that. We don't anticipate any cost increase for that particular project. We just need to finish up and the weather to work with us.

Dr. O'Brien commented:Speaker: Brenda Garcia

• Bond program savings Investment Earnings is at \$1,848,895 and Bond Savings is currently at \$6,660,887.

Question/Answers

- Question: Anything coming down the pipe that might be a hiccup?
- Brenda Garcia responded: The only one that's on my radar right now would be Lee and Gentry Fine Arts Building, but again that is so preliminary at this point that we are still working on the design. I think we have previously mentioned San Jacinto, but again right now there nothing to report on that as far as an overage.
- **Question:** We didn't have a report on transportation, I would like a report on how we are doing on buses and about the new technology that lets the parents know where their kids are?
- Brenda Garcia responded: Yes, I will reach out to that department and make sure we receive a report for our next meeting.
- **Dr. O'Brien commented:** We added 30 buses which improved our routing. Transportation was asked to reduce the commute time for all student both AM and PM from a 90 minute commute to a 60 minute commute. That has created a little bit of hardship. We added the buses to help with that, but has also included a bit of a backlog at some of the campuses because so many people are coming all at once. There is a whole lot of traffic on the 1st two weeks of school but that will ease up. I wanted to confess this was me adding buses to campuses for drop-offs in the compress time frame getting student to and from.
- Question: When we receive the report next time, I would like to know how many buses do we still have on inventory that does not have a seat?
- Brenda Garcia responded: Yes, ma'am.
- **Dr Price responded:** We have approximately 235 buses, but I will get you an accurate count for our next meeting. To address the new safety technology equipment for tracking the students, due to Covid we are behind because of the manufacturer not being able to get all the parts to us. We will probably roll that out October or November, but could be push out do to the manufacture equipment capabilities.
- Question: About how many student use the bus transportation?
- Dr. O'Brien responded: 2/3rds of our students
- Dr Price responded: About 14 to 17 thousand but with Covid we are not sure. Last year we saw a decrease of students because of Covid.
- Question: Last week there was an issue with one of the bus routes where they had to many students that showed up and had to wait for that bus to make a delivery and come back, has this being resolved?
- **Dr Price responded:** Yes sir, this has been resolved. This was part of that issue as to what Dr. O'Brien was speaking about earlier. We are trying to be more effective and efficient on our time and delivery of students. To do that we made some adjustment to the routes and the use of our buses and the amount of drivers. Please remember that Covid has not only affected our students and faculty but also our drivers. Most supervisors at this time are not in house but are out there running routes because we are short on drivers.
