

GCCISD Education Foundation **Hosts Vendors Luncheon**

The rain didn't dampen the spirits of those in attendance at the recent Goose Creek CISD Education Foundation's Major Vendors Luncheon, especially when grant winner Rebecca Estrada spoke about the two grants she had been awarded by the Foundation and how they had benefitted her students.

Estrada, counselor at De Zavala Elementary, received a grant for 2014 to bring the Houston Texans program -Toro Takes Bullying by the Horns – to De Zavala to kick off the Olweus anti-bullying program. In 2015, she received her second grant from the Education Foundation for an innovative idea to enhance the character education program at De Zavala with Rock Solid Character, a 25-foot rock wall.

In her UFC Ronda Rousey outfit, complete with an almost authentic belt borrowed from Awards and Engraving – after all, it was Dress Like a Possible Career Choice Day at De Zavala - Estrada was a ray of sunshine as she described the excitement of the students and teachers when they saw some of the Houston Texans players and Toro last year. Her students were thrilled this year with setting goals for the challenge of the rock wall and working to achieve those goals. Even Randal O'Brien, superintendent of schools, was unable to resist climbing the wall.

These grants from the Education Foundation were just two of the numerous innovative teaching grants. totaling more than \$580,000, awarded to teachers since 2010

"If a teacher has a creative idea, but the district cannot fund it with the regular school budget, the teacher applies to the Foundation for a grant," said Jim

The Goose Creek CISD Education Foundation also sponsors the Students Choice Awards. Each year, senior students write essays about teachers who have had an impact on their lives, and 15 are selected to be honored at the event. In the past six years, 90 teachers have been honored for making a difference in the lives of students.

To fund these important projects, the Education Foundation relies on donations from local businesses and industry as well as from the Goose Creek CISD staff. The Education Foundation Grant Surprise Patrol buses will once again visit the schools to award grants in the spring, and the Students Choice Awards is scheduled for June.
