"In a climate of change and challenge, they develop policies and make tough decisions on complex educational and social issues that affect the entire community and the lives of individual students. They bear responsibility and oversight in Goose Creek CISD for an annual budget of \$222,608,644 million, more than 22,200 students, more than 2,900 employees and 26 campuses."

The community passed a \$267.54 million bond, approved by our Board of Trustees, and construction has begun on three new elementary schools, scheduled to open in August 2014. Also, the first senior class from IMPACT Early College High School will graduate in June.

"We proudly salute these education advocates as they provide vision and leadership for student achievement, academic programs, district funding, and school facilities. Their service ensures that decisions about local public schools are made by those most familiar with the needs of our community's children and families," said Dr. Cavazos. "These dedicated individuals deserve recognition and thanks for their unfailing commitment to the continuing success of our students now and in the future."

The men and women serving Goose Creek CISD are Daniel Blackford, president, representing District 7; Jimmy Smith, vice president, representing District 6; Augustin Loredo III, secretary, representing District 2; Jenice Coffey, representing District 5; Howard Sampson, representing District 1; Ken Martin, representing District 3 and Bryan Graham, representing District 4, who recently resigned from the Board due to a job transfer.
