

Dan Stallworth Plaque Unveiling at Stadium


Goose Creek CISD will honor the late Coach Dan Stallworth Friday, October 10, 2014, at 6:00 p.m. by Gate 1 at Stallworth Stadium before the Robert E. Lee High School vs. Goose Creek Memorial High School varsity football game. The ceremony will include the unveiling of a plaque in his honor, which will be mounted by the Gate 1 entrance to the stadium that bears his name. Download invitation here.

Coach Stallworth served as head football coach at Robert E. Lee High School from 1940 to 1956, bringing the Ganders to power in schoolboy football ranks. In his 16year tenure at REL, he earned 150 wins, 35 losses and 10 ties. His teams captured 12 district, eight bi-district, seven quarterfinal and two semifinal titles.

The Ganders made state championship appearances in 1951 and 1952, bowing to Lubbock High School in the Cotton Bowl both years.

Coach Stallworth retired from coaching in 1957, serving as Goose CISD's athletic, recreation and physical education director until 1969. He died in February 1985.

Proclaimed as one of the "winningest" coaches in Texas Football History, Coach Stallworth was a member of the Texas High School Coaches Association Hall of Honor and was chosen City of Baytown Coach of the Century.
