Stephen F. Austin Elementary School was recognized at the regular meeting of the Goose Creek CISD Board of Trustees December 16 for making a donation of \$37,203.43 to the American Heart Association.

Austin Elementary raised the most money in the southwest area, which includes six states.

The funds were raised last February through Jump Rope for Heart, and every student contributed to the campaign to raise money for research and training to help improve cardiovascular health. Students used their P. E. time to jump with their jump rope team, as well as with teachers and family members, who encouraged them to reach their goal

The AHA program also stresses the importance of living a hearthealthy lifestyle for the faculty and students of Austin Elementary.

Amy Newman, vice president of youth market for the American Heart Association, presented physical education teachers Tiffany Coffman and Charlotte Williams, along with Laura Smith, principal, Bart Cobb, assistant principal, and the top five students with a plaque and a banner showing Austin Elementary as Number One of the Top Ten Schools in Texas for donations to the American Heart Association. The five students raising the most money for the AHA were Kailey Rodriguez, \$1,015; Drake Jackson, \$765; Addison Schmidt, \$675; Sammy Johnson, \$625 and Jake Carr, \$513.

The highlight of the presentation was a video-taped, heartfelt message from Anna King, a 14-year old student from The Woodlands, who is on the heart transplant list. Anna thanked Stephen F. Austin Elementary School, administrators, teachers, students, and the community for the generous donation, which will help fund research, education and outreach for the AHA.

"From my heart to yours, thank you. You guys rock," said King, as she strummed her guitar.
