Highlands Junior seventh-grader wins district spelling bee

Eighteen of Goose Creek CISD's brightest elementary and junior school students vied for the title of school district spelling bee champion on Thursday, Feb. 23 in the Baytown Junior School auditorium.

Each student earned a place on the stage, having won her or his school's spelling bee. Round by round, these top spellers were eliminated. After Round 1, there were 12 spellers remaining.

After Round 3, more than half of the spellers had been eliminated.

As it goes every year, some words were tricky or unusual.

"Wow. That was impressive," Goose Creek CISD Deputy Superintendent Dr. Byron Terrier told the young competitors afterward. "We are very proud of all of you."

Goose Creek CISD's top speller was crowned in Round 17 when there were four students still competing. The word that gave Chinmayee Kulkarni of Highlands Junior School the championship was "drapery."

For Chinmayee, it marked her third district spelling bee title in four years. She won back-to-back titles as a Victoria Walker Elementary School fourth- and fifth-grader. She finished second in last year's spelling bee.

The Highlands Junior seventh-grader will now represent Goose Creek CISD in the regional spelling competition in March.

Rounding out the top finishers, Stephen F. Austin Elementary School fifth-grader Abigail De Guzman finished in second place, and Victoria Walker Elementary School fifth-grader Soham Datar finished in third place. (He was last year's district champ.)

Chinmayee, 13, said she had worked extra hard this year after coming in second place last year.

She also wanted to thank her principal, Mr. Foxworth, assistant principals, Mrs. Wilson, and Mrs. Crawford, campus spelling bee coordinator Kathryn Dunlop, and her language arts teacher Mrs. Rankin.
