Presentations included topics such as chemical dynamics, forensic science, environment, physics and more.

STEM is an acronym, which stands for science, technology, math, and engineering education.

These days, many business and political leaders express growing concern that not enough Americans, especially women and minorities, are headed into these fields.

The current narrative regarding the STEM crisis is that not enough high school students are encouraged to pursue higher education in these fields.

According to reports, the STEM work force is exploding and is expected to continue to grow well into the future. From 2000 to 2012, STEM jobs grew nearly 8 percent, from 2010 to 2018 that increase is expected to jump to nearly 17 percent.

Candace Ochoa, Coordinator of Science and Health for Goose Creek CISD, said STEM DAY 2012 was an overall success.
