The eighth and seventh grade points are combined for each junior school tally. The following boys team sports were tracked in the competition: football, basketball, track, tennis, and cross country. For girls, sports tracked included volleyball, basketball, track, tennis, and cross country.

Gentry earned first-place points in 8A football; 8A volleyball; eighth grade and seventh grade boys and girls track; and seventh and eighth grade boys and girls cross country.
