Many school districts have already cut staffs and are looking at partnering with other nearby school districts and consolidating some of their operations to further cut costs. It is our goal not to cut staff. However, through attrition, positions may be eliminated.

Proposals to increase class size in the lower grades to cut down on the number of classroom teachers needed have already generated much discussion at the state level.

Texas already ranks 38th among the states in per-pupil expenditures on instruction. We cannot afford to drop any lower.

The state's school finance woes are not new.

They just have not been dealt with adequately or in a timely manner in the past, and the current economic crisis is only aggravating the festering problems.



It is urgent that we all educate ourselves about the plight of Texas school districts.
