



School back in session

Summer vacation ended Monday morning for more than 21,000 students in Baytown and Highlands, and early reports indicated few problems.

The start of school means that buses are back on the road again and school officials are asking you to be careful near them and any students walking or riding their bikes to campus.

Authorities are reminding parents about some safety tips, like making sure kids are walking in the crosswalk and that drivers slow down and put away their cell phones in school zones.

Here are some facts and figures for the new school year:

- Goose Creek CISD is the 57th largest school district in Texas: 128 square miles large.
- Goose Creek CISD will serve more than 30,000 meals per day — 10,000 breakfasts and 20,000 lunches. That is about 26,000 cartons of milk per day or more than half a million cartons of milk per month.

- 20,000 rolls made from scratch per day.
- The district averages 13,000 riders on buses that travel a tad more than 1.5 million miles annually.

School back in session means more traffic on the roadways and watching your speed in school zones.

Don't forget that the speed limit is between 20 mph to 30 mph. The average fine for speeding in a school zone will cost you about \$220.

Also, remember that there is cell phone ban in school zones. If you are caught using your cell phone, you face a fine up to \$200.
