

Childhood Disintegrative Disorder

Childhood Disintegrative Disorder (CDD) is a disorder that is very similar to autism. Children who have it tend to develop normally for a couple of years then will start to lose their language, motor skills and social skills before the age of ten.

Symptoms of Childhood Disintegrative Disorder

- Agitation (this will happen with transition between normal development and loss of skills)
- Children may stop speaking or just in one words
- Loss of bladder control
- Rejecting social interaction
