# **Presenter and Special Guest Presentation:**

Ms. Kennington introduced the youth vaping presenter Paola Uranga and Ms. Valentina (Harris County Public Health Team). The representative discussed what is vaping, types of vaping and chemical used, the increased danger in adolescence and children, signs or early detection parents need be aware of and the various resources that are available to combat the deadly substances, such as NRT and yes.org that can aid with counseling and abstinence.

**Priscilla Garza- (GCCISD Special Project Coordinator)** Expanded on the youth vaping topic, started using preventive measures, and awareness through rules and guiding principles that apply to said topic. She mentioned every member and department play a vital role and should continue to spread the awareness through Catch my breath and PE.

# Patricia Pena- (GCCISD Health Services Coordinator)

Stress the importance of having everyone onboard, such as parents to have answers to important questions, while bringing about awareness and educating them via town hall meetings and other forums.

Individualized direct contact with parents is the best option to stop and prohibit the increased use among the youths in the schools.

# SHAC Health Education/Physical Activity & PE Sub Committee:

Ms. Kennington addressed the requirements for the Proclamation 2022 and Health & PE. One vendor was approved by the TEA and covered 100% of the Health TEKS for each grade strand: K-5 Quaver Education; 6-8 & 9-12 Goodheart-Wilcox. These were presented to the SHAC as additional resources to the CATCH program that is already in action.
