A. Guest Presentation: Marcelous-Williams Resource Center

 Ramonia Williams presented on behalf of Talent Yield Coalition, which sponsors the Marcelous-Williams Resource Center. Key points about the organization: Provides case management and addresses basic needs for clients. Served 3,000 individuals from 2022 to 2024; Can help with applications for food stamps, Medicaid, CHIP and other programs; Open for 10 years, based in Highlands but serves surrounding areas; Partners with other nonprofits, government entities, and churches. Health Education, Physical Education, and Fitness

- Kevin Wrobleski reported on behalf of Amanda Kennnington:
 - Kids Teaching Kids 21-Day Snacking Challenge:
 - Collaboration between high school CTE students and PE teachers
 - Includes healthy recipes, interactive videos, and wellness activities
 - Expanded to all elementary schools this year
 - Final assessment period: March 6th-13th
 - Subcommittee virtual meeting scheduled for April 8th to review physical activity policies data

Nutrition Environment and Services

- Brief update mentioned Taste-It Tuesday and CATCH Family Night
- Site visit planned for March 25th at EF Green

Health Services

- Patricia Pena reported on the All For Them program:
 - HPV vaccination grant program in partnership with UT Health
 - Expanded to high schools, with upcoming events scheduled
 - Significant growth in participation, especially at junior high level
 - Targets students as young as 11 years old (5th grade)

Mental Health and Behavioral Health

- Thresa Caldwell reported on chit-chat sessions:
 - Held for each feeder pattern
 - Recent session titled "What's Love Got to Do With It?" focused on healthy relationships
 - High engagement between parents and children
 - o Includes dinner, games, and activities for families

Community Challenge Update

- Sam Chapa provided an update:
 - Goose Creek currently in second place out of 43 schools in their category
 - o Two campuses (Lee High School and Harlem Elementary) in top 10 in Texas
 - Encouraged continued reporting of healthy actions in final week

 - o 1,600 RSVPs received so far






