OPTION D EXPLANATION

The committee requested these changes and they were not provided in an Option D for the following reasons:

Can the change on Option B for Harlem and Highlands be reflected on Option C?

This change was considered but not given to the community. Applying the Option B change for Harlem and Highlands on Option C creates the following issue:

Harlem capacity 105%

Highlands capacity 85%

Can 8L go to Banuelos instead of Walker?

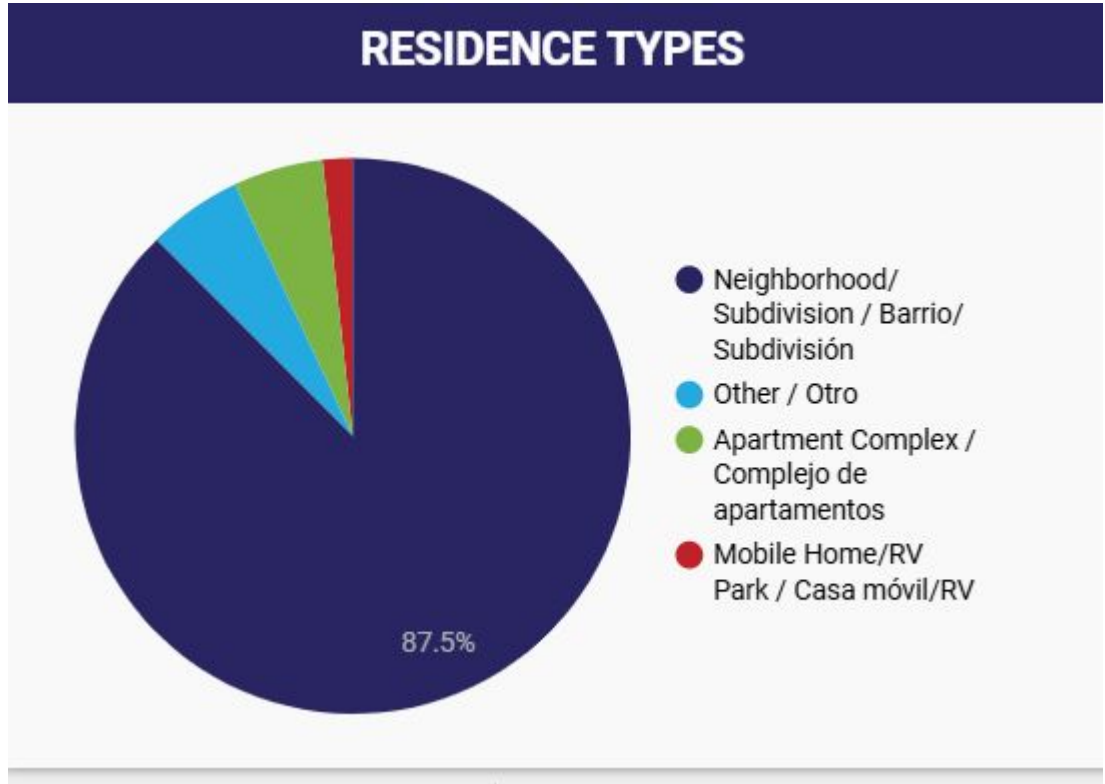
Change was considered but not given to the community.

This move would put Banuelos at ~890-950 students (2025-2033), which is 103-110%.

It would put Walker at 612-1,093 students (2025-2033), which is 69-123%

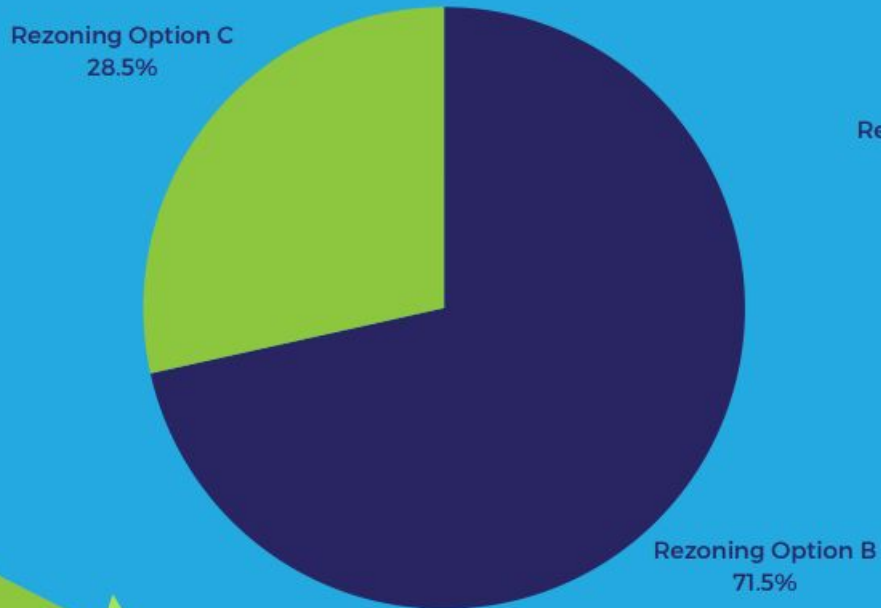
COMMUNITY SURVEY RESULTS

- 17% Against Option B & C

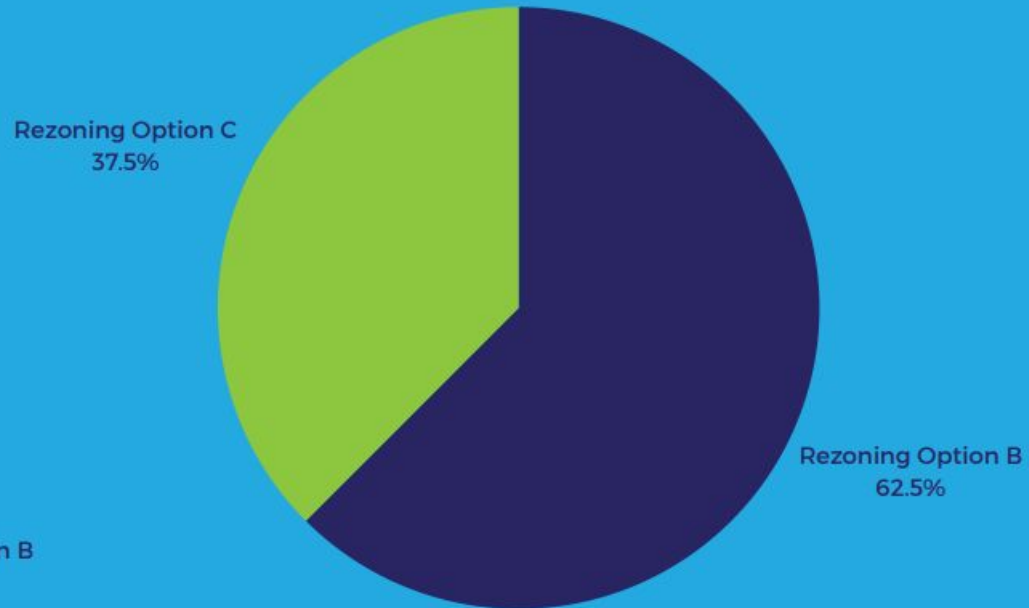

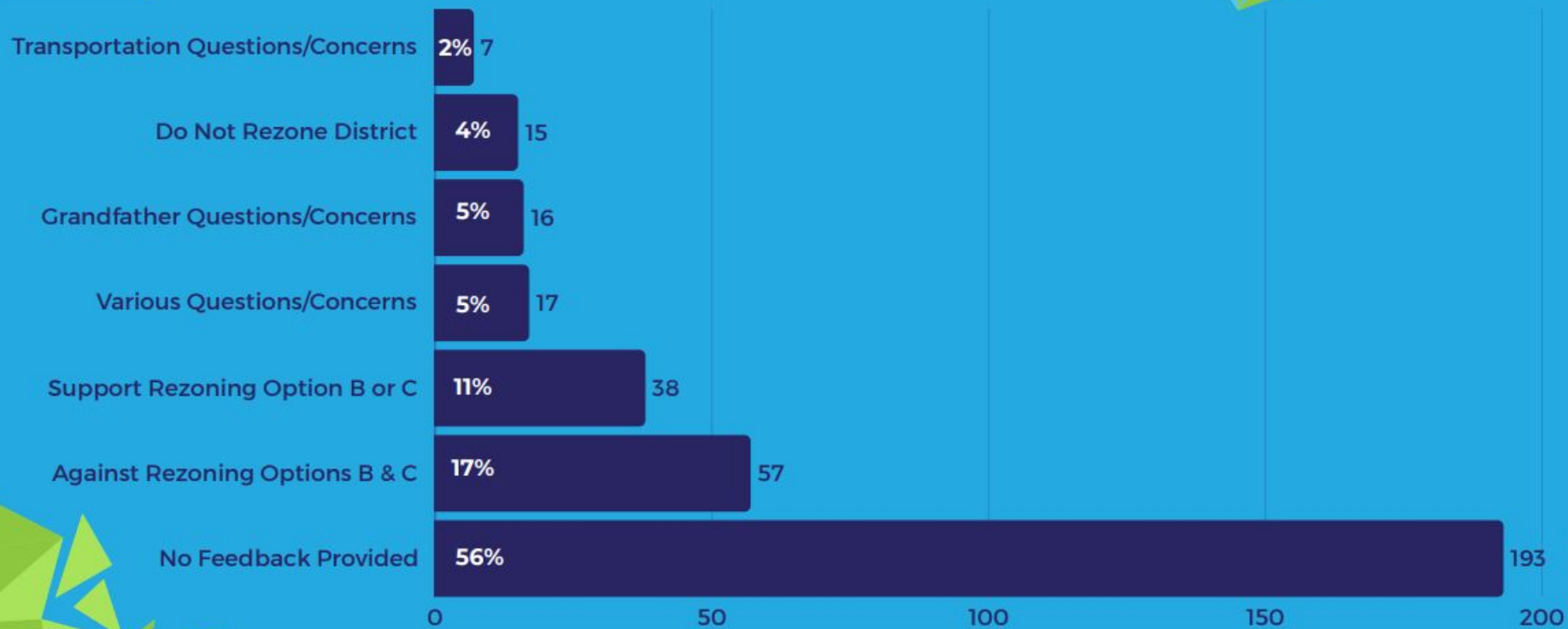

AGAINST REZONING (WRITTEN) BY CAMPUS

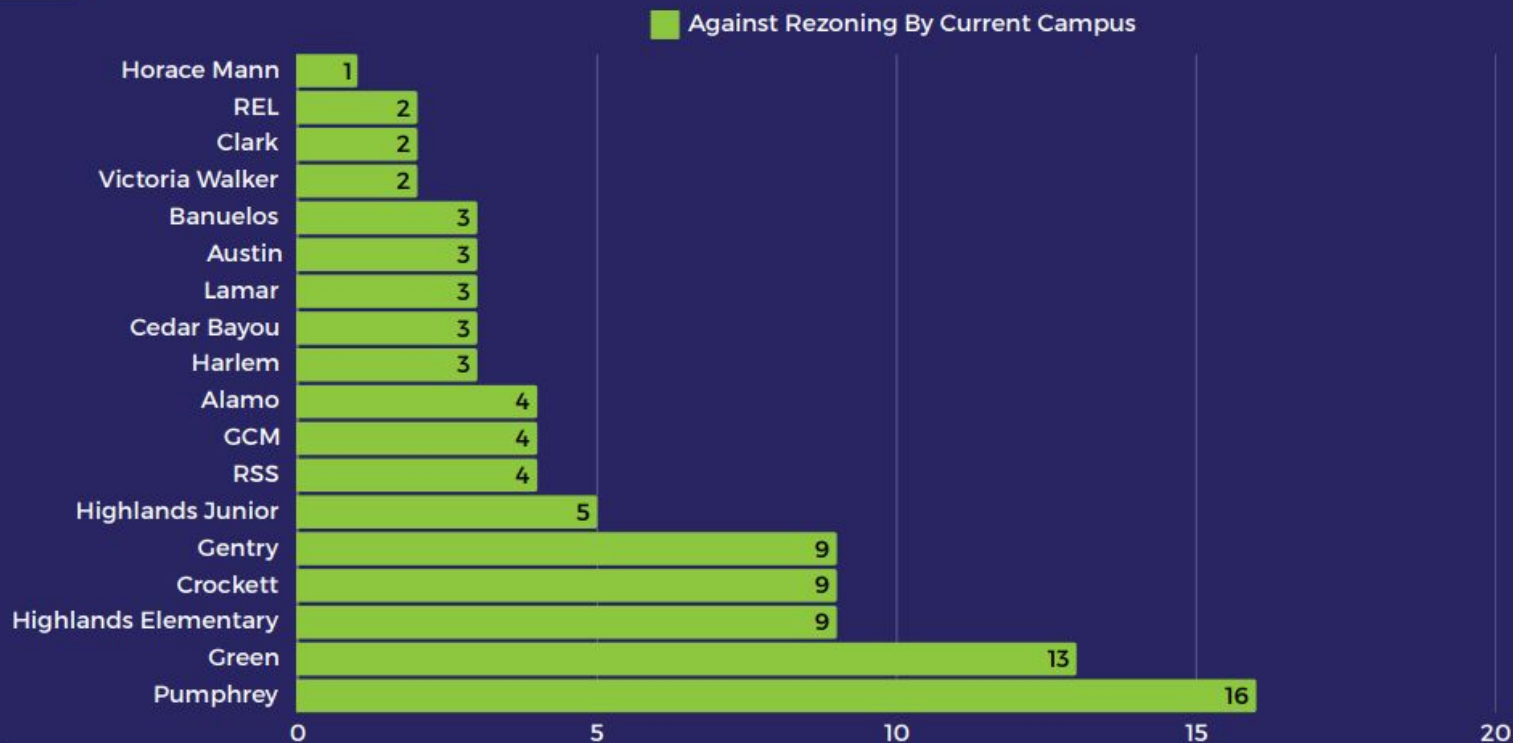

REZONING GRANDFATHER CLAUSE ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

- Due to the capacities at many schools, only 4th grade students will be eligible for the grandfather clause at the elementary level.

REZONING GRANDFATHER CLAUSE JUNIOR SCHOOLS

Options

- Option One - Current 7th graders may attend their current school if they provide their own transportation
- Option Two - Current 6th and 7th graders may attend their current school if they provide their own transportation. This does not apply to siblings that are incoming 6th graders.

REZONING GRANDFATHER CLAUSE HIGH SCHOOLS

Options

- Option One - Current 11th graders may attend their current school if they provide their own transportation
- Option Two - Current 9th, 10th and 11th graders may attend their current school if they provide their own transportation. This does not apply to siblings that are incoming 9th graders.

NEXT STEPS

- Explain that rezoning is needed to address shifting populations, repurposing Lamar Elementary School, and balancing enrollment compared to school capacity
- Explain that rezoning now will alleviate the need to build a new elementary school in the next five years
- Reference rezoning and grandfather clause Q&A after Board approval of new zones
